



The year 7 literacy and numeracy catch-up premium grant Expenditure Report 2017 – 18

1. Introduction

The Year 7 Catch-up Funding is an allocation of additional funding from the Department for Education, given to every state-funded school, including special schools and alternative provision settings, additional funding to support year 7 pupils who did not achieve the expected standard in reading or maths at the end of key stage 2 (KS2). Maintained schools and academies may spend the grant for the educational benefit of pupils registered at that school, or for the benefit of pupils registered at other maintained schools and academies. They may also spend it on community facilities, for example services where the provision furthers any charitable purpose for the benefit of pupils at the school or their families, or people who live or work in the school's locality.
